Dear Parents and Carers.

These are certainly unprecedented times! We are guided by information provided to us from the NSW Department of Education (DoE) who in turn is working closely with health experts from the NSW Department of Health. Advice is being updated daily and is indeed changing rapidly! As it is sent to us in schools, we are sending it straight out to you. I know that not every scenario will be covered by the official advice, but in these cases, common sense must prevail.

Advice received this week has reduced the maximum size of indoor gatherings. In a televised address on Wednesday this week it was announced that the Governor-General had enacted a biosecurity emergency banning non-essential indoor gatherings of 100 or more people. Restrictions on non-essential outdoor gatherings of 500 or more people would remain in place. We have cancelled or postponed all non-essential activities in the school. We have suspended until further notice a range of activities that involve having additional people on the school site. Parent meetings are now being conducted by telephone and as much as possible, we are implementing social distancing measures for both students and staff.

There is no talk at the moment of any public school closing for a lengthy period of time. Should this happen, however, there are many resources provided by the DoE to assist with learning from home. Links to these resources were included in my letter to Parents and Carers sent on Monday via SZapp. This letter also contained information on changes to planned school activities. I have included a copy of this letter for those who may

have missed it. In the unlikely event that WPPS closes, staff will continue to provide resources and introduce remote learning opportunities in line with Departmental guidelines. Please reinforce basic hygiene and health practices with your children:

Health advice for our schools

The best way to protect yourself from COVID-19 is the same way you would protect yourself from catching flu or other respiratory illnesses.

1. Wash your hands

Clean your hands for at least 20 seconds with soap and water, or use an alcohol-based sanitiser with at least 60% alcohol.

Helpful hygiene heroes Piper and Hunter are here to teach you how to wash your hands External link.

2. Cough etiquette

Cover your sneeze or cough with your elbow or with a tissue (and dispose of it immediately). Avoid close contact with people who are ill. Avoid touching your eyes, nose and mouth.

3. Stay at home if you are sick.

If your child is unwell with a respiratory illness they should remain at home until symptoms clear up.

Today the following SZapp was sent.

As everyone is aware, the Covid-19 situation is developing quickly and we would like to ensure the school community that the canteen is taking all the steps necessary to deliver meals to your children with the utmost health and safety.

The canteen will still remain open on Tuesday, Thursday & Friday until further notice. Parent volunteers will continue as rostered, however students will no longer be able to volunteer in the mornings.
