School Improvement Plan (SIP)

Our new SIP which will guide the school's direction for the next four years is well underway. The process has been changed this year to include community consultation after school staff have completed a thorough and indepth situational analysis of our school. We have been participating in frequent professional learning sessions for both whole staff and the Executive team at a network and area level. We have also been engaging in professional learning provided by a team of DoE Literacy and Numeracy Strategic Advisors who have tailored a program of learning specifically for our school. In addition, we have been analysing internal and external school data, research and literature. It has been a very rigorous process where we have carefully considered all the evidence and we are now preparing for the next stage of our journey, community consultation. In the current COVID climate one of our prime considerations is how to best harness community thought and opinion. We are very excited about the new SIP and will bring you frequent updates via the newsletter to keep you informed.





The NSW Government is helping kids get active with the new Active Kids and Creative Kids program.

Parents, guardians and carers can apply for a voucher valued up to \$100 per calendar year for each student enrolled in school.

The Sports voucher may be used with a registered activity provider for registration, participation and membership costs for sport, fitness and active recreation activities.

The Creative voucher may be used with a registered activity provider for registration, participation and tuition costs for creative arts, speech, drama, dance, digital design, coding, and music lessons and activities.
