# **Principal**

Dear Parents and Carers,

Well we certainly are living in a new world.

I wanted to start by sending a huge thank you to all of you for supporting our school community in such a positive way in recent times. It has been an unprecedented few months for everyone with drought, fire, flood and now this pandemic, and the staff have greatly appreciated the many ways that you have been showing your kindness and support for the school. I wanted also to thank you for the wonderful job that you are doing on the home front. Your children will continue with their learning because of all that you, under the expert guidance of our teachers, are doing in this area. Always remember though,

that this is all new for our children too. Sometimes, they won't want to engage in the set activities. That is okay. Engage them in lots of play based activity and physical movement. Sometimes they might just want to have some quiet time. The attention span of a child is roughly equal to their age, so for a five year old, this will be about five minutes, for a 12 year old, this will be approximately 12 minutes. Of course, every child is different, but try not to expect too much. Change their activities and rotate through exercise, play, fresh air and indoor activities and ensure a balance between active and passive times. Use household experiences to help them reinforce various concepts, for example, bake a cake together and ask your child to help you identify the ingredients in your pantry (word recognition) or measure them out (maths). This is of course age dependent on how much they can do in this space. Come back to their learning from home assigned tasks after a brain break.

Mrs Feldman sent out some very useful resources on Wellbeing. These activities and ideas are great to use as brain breaks and simply to have a bit of fun with your child. Mrs Greenwood has sent out some useful information relating to the library, please see flyer later in the newsletter.

### Home Learning Devices

Thank you so much for your phenomenal response to our "IT Ready" survey. I have sent this information to the DoE for supplementation of our school resources. We should be ready to start distribution of devices etc early next week, if not before. I will keep you updated about Student Loans in this area.

I received an email regarding the need for Vacation Care. I have sent this to you via SZapp. It is time sensitive, and the survey closes at close of business on Friday 3 April, so if you haven't completed it yet and you need vacation care, please complete this survey as a matter of urgency.

With these new developments, we felt it was appropriate to advise the community of the status of P&C related areas. Below is an update for events across term 1 and 2. Please note that as this situation is developing rapidly, we will do our best to advise changes as soon as possible.

### Band

As of Friday 20<sup>th</sup> March, all band rehearsals ceased temporarily. Music lessons were temporarily stopped from Wednesday 25th March.. Please refer to communication directly from your band co-ordinators in relation to any other matters.

Band camp that was scheduled for May has been postponed. Further details will be provided in due course

#### Canteen:

As per schoolzine app communication, the decision had been made to close the canteen as of Tuesday 24<sup>th</sup> March for the rest of the term.

#### **General Meetings**

Could you be an ethics teacher 2020 for WPPS?


We are seeking volunteers so that we can provide ethics classes for all the families who have requested it for their children.
