Principal's Report

7 February 2020

Dear Parents and carers,

Welcome

I hope everyone has had a chance to relax and refocus over the Summer holidays and now feel ready for a fresh start to the new year. Welcome back to all our familiar faces and a very warm welcome to all of our new families who are joining us this year. We know that you will settle easily into West Pymble PS and quickly become part of the community.

We have quite a few new families to the school along with a number of staff changes. Some staff have changed roles within the school and we also warmly welcome a new staff member, Mr Christopher Bedford. Chris is an experienced teacher who was previously at St Ives North PS and comes highly recommended. I would also like to congratulate Mr Simpson and his family on the arrival of their new son, Nash.

It has been a relatively good but interesting start in many ways to the new year with the extreme bushfire season and now the Coronavirus. If any of you have been impacted by the fires, please let us know. We have a suite of resources available, which have been developed by the DoE and institutions such as "Head Space", along with counselling if required. All are available by making contact with the school.

Coronavirus information is constantly being updated by the Department of Health. As we receive the information, it will be disseminated to the community via SZapp. Thank you to our community for heeding all advice and supporting all requirements.

Class Structures

Many of our classes this year are Stage based multi age classes. There are many advantages to organising classes in this manner (see the article on Multi-age Classes).

Our classes were formed on Monday Week 2 and there is very little room for movement with this due to our numbers. We made some changes in the last weeks of school and over the first week this year to ensure that Years 1 and 2 were not in very big classes. I understand that there has been some hesitation regarding the formation of multi-age classes but can assure you that the children in these classes are carefully selected according to the criteria as detailed in the WPPS Class Formation Procedures and the students thrive as much as in any other class.

The Executive team and I have looked at various alternatives in relation to class structures within the school and this particular structure is the preferred option. As experienced and professional educators, we know what we are doing and the students will thrive. Please be positive about your teachers and what they are capable of.

Multi Age Classes

Multi age (or composite) classes have been a feature of our schools for over a century. Some current and emerging pedagogical teaching and learning strategies recently "discovered" by universities, such as peer tutoring, independent learning, student directed learning and assessment, mentoring, explicit teaching, etcetera, have been around for just as long. Of course, these elements can also be found embedded in the Quality Teaching Framework, which all of our teachers use to guide their teaching practice.

The Department of Education Strategic Plan challenges schools to provide quality education for all students. Multi age grouping is one strategy that supports teachers in providing quality education for students.

Multi age groups provide opportunities for children to:

- Work together and learn from each other
- Work at their own rate, experience success and acknowledge the success of others
- Accept, value and care for others as individuals
- Foster a "sense of community" as they share the responsibility for learning

- Where possible, staying with the same class teacher over a number of years enables teachers to develop a realistic and detailed understanding of each child, their ability and their potential.

In a multi age class, children have the opportunity to work at their own level, with teachers teaching to groups according to need, as happens in “straight” classes

Given the range of abilities and learning styles in any class group of students, all classes should be considered to be multi-age or “composite”.

Please take the time to read the Sydney Morning Herald article “A class of their own” which relates to multi age or composite classes.

Class Parents

At West Pymble PS, we are very fortunate to benefit from a Class Parent system. Each class has one or two parent volunteers to assist the class teacher in various ways according to your teacher’s needs. You may be asked to cover books or organise a roster of volunteers to assist with literacy activities or you might need to disseminate P&C information, particularly in relation to volunteers required for various activities. Class Parents often organise social activities for all parents within the class. I have included a copy of the current Class Parent Roles and Responsibilities for your information. While this document is currently under review, this version, being the most current is still being utilised. It is not an onerous position and previous Class Parents have always enjoyed the role. I would encourage you to consider taking on this role for your class teacher this year as it can be what you make it and a very rewarding experience. Teachers will be talking more about the role at the Meet the Teacher Evening on Friday 21 February (Thursday 20 February for Stage 2). If you are interested, please chat with your teacher at your earliest convenience.

Safety Alert

Kiss and Drop

In most issues of the New Weekly, you will find a safety reminder. At West Pymble PS. We adhere to the adage “Safety over convenience every time!”

The Kiss and Drop Zone in Apollo Avenue operates every morning and every afternoon. In the Kiss and Drop, there is no stopping on the inward run and never, at any time, is stopping allowed in the turning circle. Vehicles are only able to stop for three minutes maximum in the designated zone on the outward run. Drivers must stay within 2 metres of their vehicle. If your child is not waiting for you, you are required to leave and come in again at the end of Apollo Avenue. Please remind all carers of these rules, grandparents, au pairs, babysitters, etc. Children should also alight the vehicle on the rear passenger’s side.

Staff Carpark

For obvious safety reasons the staff carpark is a prohibited area for both students and parents/carers. Authorised vehicles are entering and exiting at all times of the day. If you enter the school from Tristania Ave, you are required to enter the playground via the steps near the Admin building, Block A. The safety and wellbeing of our students is our main priority and we

need you to support us in this and teach our children correct safety practices.

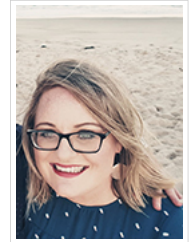
Mrs La Rosa

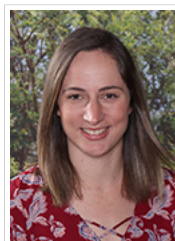
Mr Noble

We would like to start by thanking the community, the parents, the teachers, the volunteers and the students for all their support, donations and recycling.

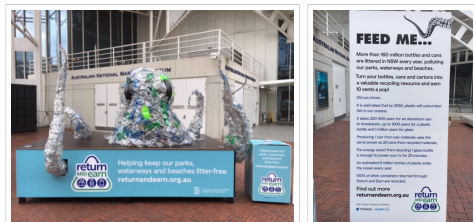

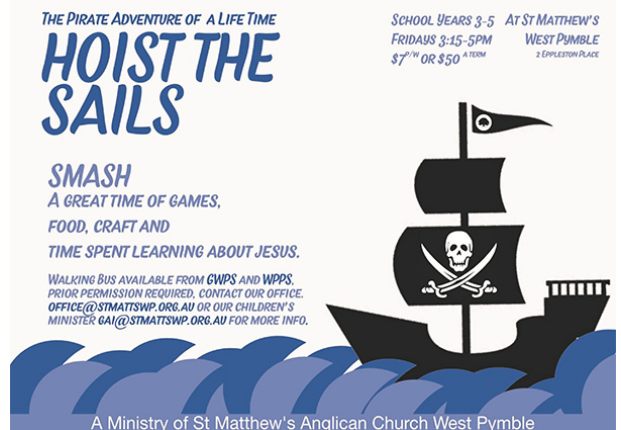
