Dear Parents and Carers,

Latest COVID Update

As you are aware, the COVID situation continues to form the guidelines for schools and corporate staff. Following the recent announcement by the Premier regarding increased measures to address the spread of COVID, schools have been asked to stress to the community the importance of keeping children at home wherever possible and to minimise mobility to stop the spread of the virus.

Changes to restrictions and requirements are reflected in our daily Situational Report and on the Department's website. The latest advice is around students who must attend school:

"Parents and carers in Greater Sydney must keep children – across primary and secondary school – at home unless they need to be at school. Schools and outside of school hours care (OOSHC) services are open for any child that needs it.

All non–core curriculum related activities are to cease on school sites.

Schools will provide a program of learning for students who attend school, and students who are learning from home. This learning will be the same whether online or in school.

Schools should revert to their remote learning mode, using existing resources and programs. For additional support, including a readiness checklist for principals, refer to Learning from home."

No child should be onsite unless it is absolutely essential. None of us would wish to be responsible for or affected by a super spreader event.

In line with DoE requirements, we will be further reducing the number of staff onsite next week with all Stage planning being

carried out remotely. Only a skeleton staff will be available for supervision and admin.

The Department of Education provides this information to us on a daily basis and it is in line with current health advice.

Behaviour Strategies for Home

This morning I joined a Zoom check-in with our DoE Secretary, Georgina Harrison, Dep Sec, Leanne Nixon and Minister, Sarah Mitchell. These are regular short, sharp sessions for Principals and Deputy Principals near the end of each week. They provide us with clarity around the latest advice and the current Public Health Orders. They also provide us with important resources. One of the topics for discussion this morning was regarding children's behaviour at home with parents requesting support in this area. Understandably, everyone is starting to feel a little frazzled and frustrated or anxious and it is during those times when students' behaviour tends to decline.

Another great resource for parents is the Department's Facebook page. Have a look at the page for help with supporting students in online learning, NSW Department of Education | Facebook. A post from 18 July by Dr Paul Wood, Acting Deputy Director Literacy and Numeracy is one to bookmark. This is the first in what looks like being an ongoing source of information for parents and educators. While this post is a recording, all future events will be live on Facebook or on the #LearnFromHome hub and you can post questions for the team to address. Dr Paul and his team will be providing support for parents with on online learning, supporting students at home and learning from home more generally. He is working with the Behaviour Strategy Team to get materials and advice together and out to families.

If you need additional support, please give us a call or send a message to us. We are here to help both you and your child.

Home Learning Packs

I would like to once again thank everyone for their ongoing support. The distribution of Home Learning Packs went

extremely smoothly. We still have a few families yet to collect their packs. If this applies to you, please call the office if you haven't already done so. As always, please let us know if you have any questions.

I hope you are continuing to stay safe and well and reducing your mobility as much as possible.

Online Learning

On behalf of all school staff, I thank you enormously for the support you have shown over the last fortnight and congratulations on settling into remote learning so successfully. We recognise the challenges that this style of learning presents to families but please be assured that we will continue to support you all during this time. Many of our staff are parents too and are experiencing the same issues when trying to juggle school commitments and teaching their own children! We are in this together and the resilience and strength of our community will get us through this difficult period, ensuring that your children continue to be involved in a quality learning program whatever the circumstances.

I sincerely thank you for the overwhelmingly positive feedback we received from families when collecting your learning packages on Monday morning. The vast majority indicated they were very happy with the various learning programs that have been developed by each stage. We do realise that this is not a perfect time for anyone and our teachers are doing their very best to support you. I ask if you experience any problems you remain patient and reach out to your classroom teacher or to the school and we will work to resolve any issue you may be experiencing.

Online Learning Platforms

- K-2 students are using Seesaw
- 3-6 students are using Google Classroom

The reasoning behind using different learning platforms across the school is due to the different stages of learning and levels of independence between infants and primary students.

Class Zoom Meetings

All classes have now conducted at least one Zoom meeting. These are an important way of students connecting with their peers and maintaining positive wellbeing in these difficult times. Teachers have tried to schedule these sessions at different times in recognition of the fact that many families will have multiple students attempting to access them.

Teacher Feedback

Staff have been spending many hours delivering feedback to students on the work they have posted to Seesaw or Google Classroom. Teachers are trying to give this feedback while planning for the coming weeks and in many instances home schooling their own children. In addition, each staff member is rostered onsite a day a week to assist with the supervision of children of essential workers. Please note that on this day, only minimal feedback will be given.


