

# PBEL At Classroom Expectation



Thank you for supporting the students and teachers in implementing our PBEL fortnightly focus. This is an example of one class' expectations. Each class will have their own unique expectations. These will change throughout the year.

# **Principal**

Dear Parents and Carers,

#### SUCCESSFUL STUDENTS

We all want our students to achieve the very best outcomes possible. If they are to have the best chance at success, they need to be taught organisational skills from a very early age so that these skills can become embedded in their behaviours as automatic responses. Punctuality is a very big part of this preparation for success.

It is of great concern, the significant number of students who arrive after the 9:10am bell each morning. Our school day starts promptly at 9:10am and continues through to 3:10pm when the children are dismissed. Should students regularly miss any part of that time, it places them at a distinct disadvantage. In the morning, they will have missed essential information relating to the day ahead as well as organisational time. Often, these students spend the day "chasing their tails" or trying to catch up. Students who miss the end of the day, will be missing information relating to the following day or important information to take home. It is also very disruptive to teachers who have started their teaching and to fellow students when interrupted by students arriving late or departing early. Of course, there are always extenuating circumstances, the students referred to here are those who make it a habit.

Students who are punctual to school, always appear calm and in control and are well organised to make the most of their day, that is, to achieve success.

Success comes in small steps – and so does failure. Failure is not a single event. We don't fail overnight or on a single test day. For most of us, failure is nothing more than a few errors in judgment, a few poor choices, repeated every day.

Now why would anyone be so foolish as to repeat a poor choice every day? The answer is because we don't think it matters.

On their own, our daily acts don't seem very important. One more TV program, an extra hour or two at the computer, sleeping in for another hour, hanging out with friends, skimping on chores – these don't usually result in an instant and measurable impact. More often than not, we escape from any immediate consequences of our deeds, until we find ourselves ill prepared for an important test or having wasted so much time, trying to catch up with our peers seems impossible.

Take just a few minutes every day to look further down the road. Consider the future consequences of your present choices.

Then make new choices for success. By looking towards the future, we can change our thinking, improve our choices and develop new habits.

One of the exciting things about the small steps formula for success is that the results are almost immediate. As we change our daily habits, we experience positive results in a very short period of time. When we cut 100 calories a day, our health and waist measurement improve noticeably in just a few weeks. When we start exercising regularly, we feel a new vitality almost immediately. When we begin studying, we experience a growing confidence and a new level of understanding in class.

Success breeds success and once we taste the pleasures of succeeding, it becomes too difficult to slip back into our old habits of failure.

The Department of Education and Communities policy "Enrolment of Students in NSW Government Schools: A Summary and Consolidation of Policy" states the following:

'The government school system in New South Wales exists to provide high quality

education for all students. The education for all students. The Education Reform

Act 1990 outlines the objects of education and the legal requirements for

compulsory schooling. In brief, the legislation requires students between the

ages of six and seventeen to be enrolled at a government or registered

non-government school, and to attend school on each day that instruction is provided

or to be registered for home schooling. It is the duty of the parent or carer of the

student to ensure that these obligations are fulfilled.'

This implies full day attendance, not partial daily attendance. The class roll, which is a legal document, is marked with a partial attendance for any child in any class, who is not in attendance at school for any part of that school day, whether it be for five minutes or two hours. Students whose behavior is of concern are referred to the DoE Home School Liaison Officer.

From now on, I look forward to seeing all our students arriving punctually to school, enjoying time in the playground before the bell, socialising with their friends and ready to seize the day!

#### Creative Outdoor Learning Space

The next phase of our playground upgrade, the Kindergarten space, has commenced and weather permitting, this will be completed in approximately four weeks. I have included a copy of the concept map which will be very similar to the final product. A few elements have changed in order to keep the cost under our \$50K cap from the Department of Education, such as the tepee, but any omissions this time round can be caught up at a later stage.

#### Road Safety in the Early Years of School

Starting school means lots of changes for you and your child. It is crucial to plan and talk about safe travel to and from school with your child.

Starting school probably means your child will see themselves as a "big kid". They may even want to travel to school by themselves, with friends or siblings. However, your young child is still developing many of the skills they need to be safe in a road traffic environment.

Until your child is at least 8 years old, hold their hand:

- on the footpath
- in the car park
- when crossing the road

Up until at least 10 years old, supervise your child very closely, holding their hand when crossing the road. If a hand isn't available they should hold an arm, bag, clothes or the pram.

In the early years of your child's schooling, there are many road safety considerations for you to think about.

#### The route to and from school may be unfamiliar

Plan a safe route together and practise walking it on weekends or school holidays. As you walk together, talk about all the things you are doing to keep you both safe.

#### Most journeys to and from school are in peak hours

Roads are full of people and vehicles. The roads around schools are busy places and can make the journey to school hazardous. Always closely and actively supervise your child. Hold hands together when walking on the footpath and crossing the road. You should do this until they are at least ten years old.

#### The beginning and end of the school day can be hectic

Entering or leaving the school can be a source of great excitement or even stress! Your child may not be focused on their own safety. Arrange a safe place to meet inside the school grounds or on the school side of the road. Never call your child across the road and please do not come onto the road to call your child from the school gates.

#### Using and sharing pedestrian road safety messages

At school, your child will learn about road safety as part of Personal Development, Health and Physical Education. Help them learn the pedestrian safety messages by using them and sharing them whenever you are out and about.

Hold a grown-up's hand when you're:

- on the footpath
- in a carpark
- crossing the road


#### Harmony Day

Dear Parents and Carers,


